Sir Patrick Stewart: Knight of Many Valents by Maggie Caracappa

Patrick Stewart took the stage in the Marriott Atrium Ballroom, Fri at 1PM, to thunderous applause. He promptly asked for the house lights to be brought up so that he could get a better look at the audience. Suffering from allergies, he asked for someone to get him some more tissues, to which a member of the audience passed up a packet of tissues from her bag. While the audience Q&A was getting organized, the moderator asked whether Stewart liked being addressed with the honorific or whether it was strange. Stewart replied that he does like it, but that it's still new to him. During his answer, the moderator knelt at his feet, which made Stewart laugh. There's no need

to kneel, but he did note that he should be addressed as Sir Patrick, as opposed to Sir Stewart.

There will be a

few chances to see Stewart on both the big and small screens soon. He recently filmed a movie, *Stuck*, in which he plays a character stuck inside an elevator on the outside of a building under construction. He is also hoping that a movie currently making the rounds of the Jewish Film Festivals will be widely released. *Hunting Elephants* was filmed in Hebrew, which Stewart's character neither speaks nor understands. Finally, Stew-


art is entering a genre that he has never done before: a half-hour comedy. *Blunt Talk* will start filming in January.

Stewart ended the panel by passing on the best advice he's ever received. It was from one of his acting teachers in drama school, but he noted that it has taken over 25 years for him to really understand it. The advice is: Never achieve success by ensuring against failure. It's important to take risks and not to always make the safe choice.

As the panel concluded, Stewart signed the packet of tissues and returned them to the fan who had provided them.

Daily Dragon (DD): What inspired you to write your book? Cary Elwes (CE): The fans have pressured me over the years. I realized now is a good time, before my memory completely starts to fade and I won't remember any of it. It was a joyful experience for me. It was



wonderful going down memory lane.

DD: *Did* you keep a journal? Or did you just remember it all?

CE: I went to

lunch with Norman Lear, and I expressed my fear to him—how was I going to remember all this? He said, "I'm going to give you all the call sheets from the movie." As I started reading them, I remembered where I was, what I was shooting, and who I was with. That's the beautiful thing about memory. It's amazing what it takes to jog it.

CE: I had a great deal of help from Joseph Layden, who is a very talented, accomplished writer. And all the cast contributed to the book. So it's really an ensemble book. I can't take full credit.

DD: I imagine you're always asked to say a particular three-word phrase, but if you could choose one line out of the entire movie as your favorite, what would it be?

CE: "Anybody want a peanut?"

Covering the Spectrum in YA Lit by Shae Connor

Friday morning, a panel consisting of librarian Christopher Elliott, Harmony Ink Press YA coordinator Nessa Warin, authors Cinda Williams Chima and Stephanie Perkins, and YA lit fan Casey Fiesler tackled the question of "LGBTQA Representation in YA." The panelists discussed defining the genre and agreed that LGBTQA novels should feature main characters who identify on the spectrum.

Chima said focusing on the story first and peopling it with

diverse characters is the way to go. "I think there are a lot of ways you can support, whether by writing a protagonist or a secondary character," she said. "Either way, it's important to have these characters as part of the cast in your stories."

One challenge often faced for books with LGBTQA characters is that librarians and booksellers sometimes need to be convinced that the books will circulate. Show support by checking out or buying these books yourself, Warin said, "even if they're not your thing." Chima agreed. "When you hear about these books, buy them."

Even when LGBTQA books are available, making them visible to readers can be critical. The panelists recommended shelving all YA books together and using special displays or small handouts like bookmarks to highlight LGBTQA titles.
